Amazon RAM is a service that helps you securely share your Amazon resources to other Amazon accounts. If you use Amazon Organizations to manage your accounts, then you can share your resources with your entire organization or to organizational units (OUs). For supported resource types, you can also share resources with individual Amazon Identity and Access Management (IAM) roles and users.

The HTTP query examples in this guide do not show every header field that might be included in the response; you might see others. Only the ones with relevance to the example are included.

Accepts an invitation to a resource share from another Amazon Web Services account. After you accept the invitation, the resources included in the resource share are available to interact with in the relevant Amazon Web Services Management Consoles and tools.

Adds the specified list of principals and list of resources to a resource share. Principals that already have access to this resource share immediately receive access to the added resources. Newly added principals immediately receive access to the resources shared in this resource share.

- A service principal name, for example: service-id.amazonaws.com

### Example 1: add a principal to a resource share

The following example illustrates adding an organizational unit (OU) as a principal to a resource share that exists in the Amazon Web Services Region us-east-1. After running this command, all Amazon Web Services accounts in the specified OU can access the resources in the resource share.

### AssociateResourceSharePermission

Adds or replaces the Amazon RAM permission for a resource type included in a resource share. You can have exactly one permission associated with each resource type in the resource share. You can add a new Amazon RAM permission only if there are currently no resources of that resource type currently in the resource share.

### permissionArn

Specifies the <u>Amazon Resource Name (ARN)</u> of the Amazon RAM permission to associate with the resource share. To find the ARN for a permission, use either the <u>ListPermissions</u> operation or go to the <u>Permissions library</u> page in the Amazon RAM console and then choose the name of the permission. The ARN is displayed on the detail page.

Specifies the Amazon Resource Name (ARN) of the resource share to which you want to add or replace permissions.

Required: Yes

#### clientToken

Specifies a unique, case-sensitive identifier that you provide to ensure the idempotency of the request. This lets you safely retry the request without accidentally performing the same operation a second time. Passing the same value to a later call to an operation requires that you also pass the same value for all other parameters. We recommend that you use a UUID type of value..

If you don't provide this value, then Amazon generates a random one for you.

If you retry the operation with the same ClientToken, but with different parameters, the retry fails with an IdempotentParameterMismatch error.

Type: String

Required: No

#### permissionVersion

Specifies the version of the Amazon RAM permission to associate with the resource share. You can specify only the version that is currently set as the default version for the permission. If you also set the replace pararameter to true, then this operation updates an outdated version of the permission to the current default version.



#### Note

You don't need to specify this parameter because the default behavior is to use the version that is currently set as the default version for the permission. This parameter is supported for backwards compatibility.

Type: Integer

Required: No

#### replace

Specifies whether the specified permission should replace the existing permission associated with the resource share. Use true to replace the current permissions. Use false to add the permission to a resource share that currently doesn't have a permission. The default value is false.



#### Note

# **Common Errors**

#### ExpiredTokenException

The security token included in the request is expired

HTTP Status Code: 403

### **IncompleteSignature**

The request signature does not conform to Amazon standards.

HTTP Status Code: 403

#### **InternalFailure**

The request processing has failed because of an unknown error, exception or failure.

HTTP Status Code: 500

#### MalformedHttpRequestException

Problems with the request at the HTTP level, e.g. we can't decompress the body according to the decompression algorithm specified by the content-encoding.

HTTP Status Code: 400

#### **NotAuthorized**

You do not have permission to perform this action.

HTTP Status Code: 401

#### OptInRequired

The Amazon access key ID needs a subscription for the service.

HTTP Status Code: 403

### RequestAbortedException

Convenient exception that can be used when a request is aborted before a reply is sent back (e.g. client closed connection).

HTTP Status Code: 400

### RequestEntityTooLargeException

Problems with the request at the HTTP level. The request entity is too large.

HTTP Status Code: 413

### RequestExpired

The request reached the service more than 15 minutes after the date stamp on the request or more than 15 minutes after the request expiration date (such as for pre-signed URLs), or the date stamp on the request is more than 15 minutes in the future.

HTTP Status Code: 400

### RequestTimeoutException

Problems with the request at the HTTP level. Reading the Request timed out.

HTTP Status Code: 408

#### ServiceUnavailable

The request has failed due to a temporary failure of the server.

HTTP Status Code: 503

## **ThrottlingException**

The request was denied due to request throttling.

HTTP Status Code: 400

#### UnrecognizedClientException

The X.509 certificate or Amazon access key ID provided does not exist in our records.

HTTP Status Code: 403

## UnknownOperationException

The action or operation requested is invalid. Verify that the action is typed correctly.

HTTP Status Code: 404

## ValidationError

The input fails to satisfy the constraints specified by an Amazon service.

HTTP Status Code: 400
